AT HARVARD WE SAY UNDER 35K NOT OK!

On June 14, the Local 26 Bargaining Committee proposed a minimum annual income of \$35k a year for Harvard dining services workers.

SUSTAINABLE JOBS: END POVERTY AT HARVARD

53% of Harvard dining services workers make less than \$35,000 a year. That's not enough to sustain us.

We look forward to the Administration's response to our innovative approach to tackling income inequality & poverty here at the University.

In addition, we proposed yearly raises of approximately \$1 a year.

WE WANT HEALTHY LIVES

Harvard Administration has asked us to accept a proposal that would increase the cost of seeking care.

We are not willing to accept proposals that would make it harder for us to take our children to the doctor.

We think we can do better than that at Harvard.

WELCOMING WORK

We reached a tentative agreement with the University on improvements to the grievance procedure.

We have another session with the University on Friday and union committee meetings on Wednesday.
